The Symptoms (TünetEgyüttes)

Interactive Fairytale Theater for Kindergarten-age Kids Nook is recommended for children aged 3 to 7. “Because Nookville is real good. 18:00 – BAJDÁZÓ Concert

„Everything that we recorded during our journey resonates in our music, from Carl Perkins to Tamas Cseh, J. L. Hooker and



Jan Garbarek to Hungarian folk ballads or Lakota songs. But it is still one single thing: Börzsöny music.”

Hypnotic lo-fi – psycho – folk music from Börzsöny, their new record was one of Hungary's best albums in 2011. The music rides on tenderly floating guitar tunes, with or without the support of the subtle rhythm section; this is what props the leisurely – sometimes even hesitant – guitar and other melodies, effects and bird twitter. Sometimes the songs are pulled together by one or another more definite melody, evoking American folk music with surprising strength, while at other times it spreads into ambient or even more so, a landscape painting of sounds. The Hungarian lyrics, on one hand, bring forth the pictures and wisdom of folklore, and on the other hand, carry an undefinable surrealism.

The general effect is nevertheless not exactly psychedelic in a sense that it would invite you to abandon yourself in it, it is rather hypnotic, it doesn't call, but sucks you right into a unfamiliar-homey world, it sets your own personal rhythm of peacefulness.

20:00 – HANG-TABLA IN-FUSION Concert

The Hang is one of the youngest instrument on the world, the tabla one of the oldest. To listen to this instruments together is a musical time traveling, sometimes you feel you are in the past sometimes in the future.

22:00 – ROMANO DROM Concert

Romano Drom is one of the most prominent representative of the contemporary Gypsy culture in Hungary. Since its foundation in 1999, the Band have traveled the world from Canada to South Korea, from Norway via Portugal to Ukraine and Serbia. Romano Drom 's unique musical world got them resounding success and made them one of the most sought after world music band with a Gypsy heritage. Romano Drom, meaning “Gypsy's road”, plays in original Olah Gypsy language with modern scoring. Although their original compositions are deeply routed in the

ancient Olah Gypsy music, they can reach a wider audience by integrating the authentic gypsy melodies with influences from world music and several modern trends.

Their success lies in their unique fusion music in which Antal Kovács (founder and composer of Romano Drom) combines the centuries-old musical culture with Catalan rumba, Arabic, Balkan and even pop rhythms. In the musical arrangement, he is utilising guitar, bass/double bass, as well as the traditional pot and spoon in order to achieve a unique and captivating sound.

Profound emotions, energy and honesty. This is how the music of Romano Drom can be described. Their music proudly carries on the traditions of the predecessors, while tapping into a contemporary subconscious. Through this modern bridge they can successfully convey the ancient energy even to those, who have not been touched by this culture before.

The band has published five albums with domestic and European distribution, including a remix album that is unique within the genre. The latest album of this ground breaking and innovative world music ensemble, Romano Drom, is already under preparation.

00:00 – SANKOLOKAN Concert

The Sankolokan band was established in 2008 and gives extra-ordinary insights to West African music in Hungary. Their's concerts are introduced by the chilling melodies of the African harp (chora), and they play hot Malinke rhythms on drums (djembe, dundun, sangban, kenkeni) accompanied by songs, dance and melodic instruments (balaphone, Guinean flute).

Their's music stands out not only in Hungary but in the neighbouring countries as well in terms of African rhythms.

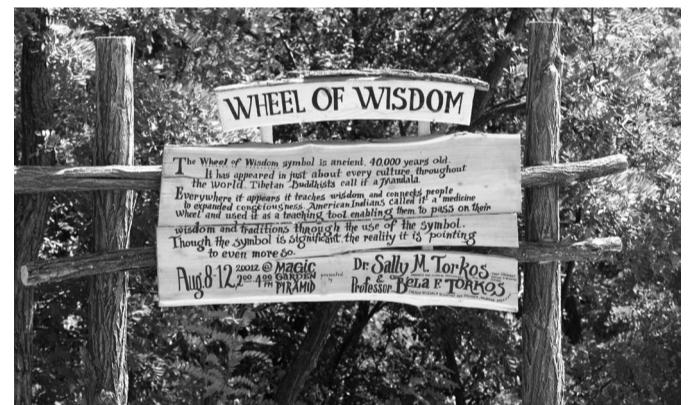

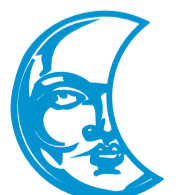

(Continued from the previous issue) The main thing is not the search for contacts or sex partners, but a more subtle way of connecting with each other. The positive feelings that are experienced at the parties are of a longer-lasting nature giving you the power to better cope with everyday life afterwards again. Sure, not every party is paradise on Earth, there are always exceptions. But we are talking about the principal features of the scene here and not looking at anomalies (a critical in-depth look at the scene is to be found in the final chapter 42). The passion for traveling and picking up experience means that you keep on meeting everyone on dancefloors scattered around the globe. The rituals of greeting, after not having seen each other for months or perhaps years at a time is far more enthusiastic than in any other scene. The friendships that have been made span all cultures, nations and religions. The openness that is lived makes racism, nationalism, sexual preferences and religious hate totally obsolete. Goa festivals, just like the hippie communes in the sixties, are the manifestation of the archetypal future global society in which freedom, love, a lust for life and a sense of togetherness count much more than any differences. Outbreaks of violence at a Psytrance festival is one of the worst violations of the unwritten rules of Goa trance. If such an outbreak does happen it usually only lasts a few seconds. Suddenly, others rush in to transform the negative energy with their loving embraces.

Even the hierarchical structure between artists and dancers becomes a thing of irrelevancy. DJs, VJs or deco-people are normally not screened by big security guys and can later be found dancing with the others in the colourful pandemonium.

By being released from the constraints of everyday life and under the influence of psychoactive substances, many fraggles find themselves able to talk to strangers about their problems, complexes and life-long inhibitions in the chill-out area. Other people wear such funny outfits that they immediately conjure up a smile



wherever they go. Life's deadly seriousness is left standing at the entrance for them to deliberately become elves, pixies goblins, aliens or just an Easter rabbit in a cuddly costume. Being able to laugh at yourself or suddenly crying tears of joy is a step forward towards self-awareness. What could be more exciting than your own psychotherapy at a festival (usually held at ancient power spots or in beautiful landscape locations that would be worth visiting for their own sake anyway)? Awareness of nature, ecological thinking and spiritual and emotional development are important for many when they visit the healing areas, areas of silence, only perhaps broken by the gentle strains of ambient music. Meditation, massage, breathing techniques, Tantra, Zen, shamanistic rituals, spiritual readings or wellness zones are the oases of peace after the tornado on the mainfloor. The extremes at the festivals could not be greater. And it is these extremes, these opposites that again find expression in the symbols in the large backdrops around the main stage at the festivals. Natraj, the dancing Shiva – stands for the

destruction of the old and the creation of the new – is also a symbol of the transformation of the Goanaut to a higher, better and happier being, one that is continual development. The bi-polarity of life and perception is the epitome of Yin-Yang. The two faces of the Indian Goddess Kali is another expression of this concept. The Indian, Tibetan or Maya deities in the visuals and pictures are the colourful apparitions between the opposites, the aspects of the experience of being alive. It is the contradiction of all life that is finally united in the cosmic syllable OM.
