



PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE

TONIGHT A TRUE ACID LEGEND, EMMANUEL TOP IS PLAYING @ THE PUMPUI STAGE. WE ASKED HIM A COUPLE OF QUESTIONS ABOUT THE PAST, THE PRESENT AND THE FUTURE.

- How do you remember the golden age of acid? What were the most memorable parties?

- Love Parade Berlin.

- You can find classic acid sounds mostly in the psychedelic scene. Have you been following that scene, were you aware that this genre took acid further? – Acid music started for me in 1988 with Chicago house label, international Dj Traxx Records. And artists such as Armando, DJ Pierre aka Phuture, Lil Louis.

- TB-303, TR-909 - legend. In 2016 what is your approach to making music? - The basic machines to make acid and techno. Nothing has changed. SH 101, Juno 106, MC 202, Jupiter 8... All Roland series they made in the 80's. I think they didn't realise what they had produced at the time.

- I don't know how sensitive the B.B.E. topic is... You can still hear Seven Days and One Week on a daily basis on commercial radio. What happened to this project? - Basically it was a title trance track that quickly became very commercial because it was the expectations of the time (1996). 20 years later I see that this title is always a summer hit in Ibiza. - If I am not mistaken, you haven't been to Ozora yet. What are your expectations?

RENA: PACE YOURSELF... I'VE BEEN PARTYING FOR MANY YEARS AND FINALLY LEARNT THE ART OF 'LESS IS MORE.' IF YOU COULD ONLY BRING THREE ITEMS TO OZORA, WHAT WOULD THEY BE? JULES: SUNGLASSES, HAT AND EARPLUGS.

RENA: MY LAPTOP, TRAKTOR CONTROLLER AND MIC!

Best advice you would give to someone coming to a psy-trance festival for the first time.

Jules: Festivals are a great place to make new friends and meet new people. But I think it's really worthwhile getting a group of friends to come with you as a crew.

TRY AS MANY NEW EXPERIENCES AS POSSIBLE. IT'S GREAT TO HAVE A BASE TO RETURN TO WITH SOME FAMILIAR FACES TO EXCHANGE STORIES AND VIBES.

Rena: I second that! Also be open to having fun and meeting lots of great people.

So Jules, let's talk about the label and its inception...

Jules: I set up the label to have full control over my creative direction. With an intention to help new producers with their production through collaboration. And Rena, you've been in the co-pilot seat for some time now. Tell us how you met Jules and got involved with the label.

Rena: I have known Jules for around 15 years. We were introduced by Dick Trevor. At the time I was in a girl group and we were looking for a producer to work with. We got into the studio with Jules and wrote a

really cool commercial song with a psychedelic hint. Soon after, I discovered psychedelic trance and Jules and I have been working together ever since. When Jules formed Aphid Records in 2009, he signed me as a DJ and introduced me to production in 2011, which is when we wrote our first collaboration track 'Psychic Traveller'. I'm also proactive in helping Jules run the label and assist with promotion and label releases. You've both been very busy with your own album projects. Rena - following a series of EP releases, we know you've got an album on the way. Tell us more!

Rena: Yes, I do intend to write an album. This year my focus has been on building my studio (which Jules did a great job of) - and also preparing my live set. After the summer tour, I'm looking forward to being locked in the studio to start work on my debut Psibindi album. I plan to do a few collaborations as well as some of my own solo compositions.

And Jules - you've also been quite busy - especially with the birth of your daughter! So firstly congratulations on that! In fact, there seems to be a lot of parents on the psy-trance stage these days. How are you finding the balance and who (or which artist) has given you the best piece of advice for achieving it so far?

JULES: HAVING A CHILD IS AN AMAZING THING TO HAPPEN AND ONLY MAKES YOUR LIFE RICHER. IT'S A LOT OF WORK BUT IT ONLY MAKES ME MORE DETERMINED TO FOCUS ON MAKING A MORE PRO-FESSIONAL CREATIVE SUCCESS OF THE LABEL. NO ONE HAS GIVEN ME ANY SPECIFIC ADVICE BUT YOU CAN SEE THAT MANY OF THE PSY TRANCE

PRODUCERS IN UK FROM MY PEER GROUP WHO NOW HAVE FAMILIES - THEY CONTINUE WITH VERY SUCCESSFUL PSY-TRANCE CAREERS, WHICH SPEAKS FOR ITSELF.

Jules, you've also been busy with the production of a new album featuring lots of rather exciting collaborations... Who have you been working with? Jules: My new album is a series of collaborative tracks, many of them written while I've been playing in different countries. I'm just putting the final touches to the mixes. It's a great line up of friends and freaks with Contineum, Tron Ajja, Section 8, Hypnocoustics, Psymmetrix, Nirmal and our own Kaptain Kairos and Psibindi. The tracks were written in Goa, Mexico, Switzerland and of course my studio in the UK. The whole project has been a great exchange of ideas, creative vibes and friendship. You learn a lot about each other when you are holed up in a studio for five days. Rena, you play at 8.30am on Wednesday and Jules you'll be rocking out Saturday night at 9.30pm. Tell us what we can expect from your individual sets. Rena: You can expect a breakfast boogie with my new live set! I'll be singing, mixing and triggering various FX on my vocals. My live set is made up of all my previous releases, so it will be the first time to experience this exclusively at Ozora! I'm really looking forward to the whole experience and being a part of this great, psychedelic festival.

Jules: It's difficult to put into words, but I can say I go on instinct with my set, so there is no pre-planned order. I try to follow the vibe I feel from the crowd. I expect it will be electric as Ozora is one of my all-time favourite festivals.



MULTIDIMENSIONAL MUSICAL JOURNEYS IN THE CHAMBOK

The last inhabitant of that little house next to the Dragon Nest, was an old man called Csambok, who refused to leave the land when it was evicted, some decades ago. The legend tells that his ancestral spirit still lives inside the house. The flying saucer depicted on the house roof suggests that this is the place where to initiate a trip towards another dimension. In fact, in the Chambok, everything can happen. Every time you step in, you are about to enter into a new unexpected experience. The Chambok house is one of Ozora's hidden zones where one has the precious opportunity to feed mind and soul with a bunch of oracular lectures, conscious movies and unpredictable music. Chambok's rhythms and notes are manifold ecstatic dreams capable to help humans reconnecting with their inner self and eventually to alternate magical patterns of reality. After sunrise, in the Chambok house, a 'Good Morning' Ambient Set', starting at 7.30, performed by different eclectic artists, will refresh the Ozorians' ears guiding the souls to new horizons of peace and relaxation or to other dimensional portals. The voyage starts on Tuesday with a man called Prell, that uses cables as secret wires to connect cells and organs, and to

When Saturn comes, it is the day of Ananda Bosman, the visionary pioneer of the 432hz 'revolution', that will engage in a mind-blowing multi-layered ambient set. Few lectures, in the same day, will attempt to explain to the most intrepid minds the discussed reasoning behind 432hz tuning. MANGO

We talk to Mango, artist in the Grove for Tuesday and Wednesday. A South America aficionado, he is deeply in love with its way of life, music, and, of course, cuisine.

According to the original recipe, you use beef fat. Instead, here, not to hurt sensibilities, I am using a vegetarian version.

(He starts off by describing a vegan recipe, however, to some gentle nudging from the Ozorian Prophet, quickly veers towards the original version, and meat in general. We suggest – a scientifically proven fact – that plants also give off distress signals when damaged, so there you also hurt sensibilities) Yes I think that is right, since everything that you eat is alive. So you have to take into account that it's better to accept, then to fight or protest against it with, say, militant vegetarianism. But I also understand if you can't hunt or grow up your own animal that you decide not to consume meat. Furthermore, there is much more industrial waste amongst vegetables, whereas meat is better controlled.

So, back to empanadas, it was obviously the Spanish who exported it to Mexico, but in South America every country claims it as their own. In Mexico it's called La Saltena after a region where it became popular.

The classical one is with beef fat, a lot of meat, boiled potatoes, boiled eggs, a bit of chilli. They also make sweet ones, with ricotta, prunes... You can fill it with anything, it's a bag (laughs), so obviously, the choice is yours.

My favourite about the whole thing is that it's the most street of street foods. You are supposed to hold it in your both hands, like this, and bite off the two corners. Then you blow air through the holes to cool the inside – there it is several hundred degrees, and this helps a lot – then you can eat it easier.



RECIPE: EMPANADA DOUGH

- 4 CUPS ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR, PLUS MORE FOR DUSTING
- 2 TEASPOONS BAKING POWDER
- 2 TEASPOONS SALT
 - 1/3 CUP MELTED BEEF FAT, CUT INTO SMALL PIECES
 - 1 CUP COLD WATER
 - 1 LARGE EGG, LIGHTLY BEATEN WITH 1 TABLESPOON WATER (DO NOT BEAT UNTIL READY TO BAKE)



MIX WHITE FLOUR WITH MELTED BEEF FAT. THIS IS THE ONLY FAT THAT GIVES OFF THE TASTE OF MEAT. YOU MIX THE WHOLE THING INTO THIS... THIS KIND OF THICK DOUGH THAT IS THICKER THAN BREAD DOUGH, WITH A BIT OF SALT. YOU NEED TO ROLL IT OUT, FOLD IT UP AND ROLL IT OUT AGAIN SEVERAL TIMES. LEAVE IN THE FRIDGE TO REST OVERNIGHT.
ROLL IT OUT INTO A THIN SHEET, IT SHOULDN'T TEAR WHEN YOU LIFT IT OFF THE ROLLING BOARD. THAT'S A GOOD DOUGH. IT HAS TO BE EVEN, SO THAT THE FILLING DOESN'T PUSH OUT THE DOUGH IN PLACES. CUT CIRCLES, UH-OH (PUTS OUTSTRETCHED PALM ON THE TABLE THEN STARTS MEASURING THAT), ABOUT 15 CENTIMETRES IN DIAMETER. EVEN IF YOU WORK FAST, IT IS RECOMMENDED TO COOL SOME FO THE DOUGH DURING THIS TIME. FILL WITH ANY FILLING AS A HALF MOON, ON ONE HALF, AND LEAVE HALF A CENTIMETRE SPACE. FOLD, AND WITH A WET FINGER WORK TOGETHER THE EDGES INTO ONE SMOOTH MASS. THIS IS IMPORTANT; THE FILLING WILL SPILL IN EVEN THE SMALLEST CRACKS. FRY IN OIL.
HOWEVER, WE WORK WITH YEAST IN THE COOKING GROVE DURING MY WORKSHOP, AS DON'T HAVE OVERNIGHT TO REST IT. TO CHECK THIS, THE SPANISH VERSION, YOU CAN FIND IT OUT ONLINE (LAUGHS).



OFF THE MAP

Saci Nagy talks about The Robur, a large rusty van that's now a piece of the sculpture garden in front of Artibarn.

I was told at the last minute that there would be a project to do, something to be painted on. I faced the task only upon arrival here.

It was frightening. I didn't dare enter it for three days to clean it; I was afraid it may collapse. Also, there were wasps. However, the conceptual side was very exciting. How can something be transformed and given a new life, when I found this...erosion on the surface so beautiful. My first thought was – God, we have to keep this. There were so beautiful painterly structures and surfaces, that one went mad. Through the years, several layers of paint have gathered on its body, but underneath that all, it is just an approximately 1,5 mm sheet of rust. We had to rivet it together. There were metal sheets flapping in the wind.

When the idea was first mentioned, I thought of a motif that is recurring in my work. A life tree labyrinth. I was planning to do a moss graffiti, but then this car came about. Then finally I enlarged it in a way so that it doesn't fit on the Robur, parts of it fall off. I left one detail by making a huge stencil for both sides and then cut and glued it to the body. This took a week.

I had a wish to somehow embellish it, to make it more elaborate. Then my daughter Anna walks up to me one day from the Seven Headed Garden and brings me a leaf. It had these beautiful serrated edges, so I copied that. The idea was to break these huge monotonous arches.

It was about layers. About leaving what needs to be left. And to build from that.

Then we painted the sky over that. The day sky on one side, the night on the other. I had noticed during my time here that Ozora has a characteristically beautiful and unique skies. Inside we will place an installation. We will paint the sides with white and place roots and pieces of branches in the middle, but I dare not talk about these as we still have to do them.
