Today the grounds give home to 5 stages (each with a unique vibe and dazzling visuals), an immense art exhibition tower, numerous artrelated workshops, a pyramid for movement-based programs, a house for lectures, a circus, a fire arts space, a bio garden, an outdoor community kitchen area with cooking workshops, a children's playground, a pavilion for healing activities and countless organically developing nooks filled with enchanted land art and visual messages.

Connecting our tribe and keeping us connected throughout the year has always been at the forefront of the Ozorian mission. RadiOzora and The Ozorian Prophet were created out of this desire, and the 'One Day' event series intends to do the same. Loving is believing, and we love the idea that bonding can help us better understand ourselves and bring us closer as a growing global PsyTribe.

CHAMBOKOLOGY

Explorations of Consciousness

The Chambok House is where the lectures and roundtable talks take place in the Ozorian Valley. The topics are diverse, but as one of the curators, Giorgia Gaia, points out, "it's all about understanding reality. From eco cultures and permaculture, through esoteric and psychedelic approaches to reality-shaping magic, we're investigating the concept of 'culture' as a way of rethinking our understanding of the matrix we are living in, and discovering the physical reality of new forms of communities".

Among the Chambok's visionaries and psychonauts we can also highlight some US representatives. Our guest lecturers have included head of the Center for Planetary Culture, author of cultic books Breaking Open the Head: A Psychedelic Journey into the Heart of Contemporary Shamanism, 2012: The Return of Ouetzalcoatl, and Notes from the Edge Times, DANIEL PINCHBECK, who discussed human society as a regenerative instrument that can transform itself "using technology as well as indigenous wisdom to restore nature.

Iconic electronic music producer Juno Reactor, masterminded by Ben Watkins, (with composer Don Davis) created the legendary score and soundtrack to the reality-shaking dystopian Hollywood mega-hit The Matrix, which premiered in California on March 24, 1999, exactly 20 years and 2 months ago today. The foundations of Ozora were laid down in 1999. Juno Reactor and The Mutant Theater has been the Opening Performance of Ozora Festival twice so far. Juno Reactor was created as an art project in 1990.

BRIDGES OF MUSIC AND ART

Since 2015, our team has chosen a theme each year to channel visionary messages through the creative, educational and spiritual areas of the festival. For our 2019 inspiration we chose the symbolism of BRIDGES.

MUSIC

One of this summer's time-bridging shows will be The Pink Floyd Experience from Beyond the Wall on the Main Stage, where we also welcome US psy-delegates, founder and chief of legendary PsyTribe, Andy Barakuda, for the first time at Ozora, and audio master and Vaporvent Records co-founder, Chromatone.

On the live music Dragon Nest stage, Beats Antique David Satori is returning this summer with Evan Fraser (The Dogon Lights; Bolo) and Mark Reveley (Jed and Lucia) as Dirtwire, presenting their rebirthed, sound-kaleidoscopic Americana and some post-millennial, multicultural psychedelia. And as for truly beat-crossing over time, genre and culture, co-founder and Master Drummer of Afrobeat, Tony Allen is taking the stage with titan of electronic dance music, Detroit techno (The) Wizard, Jeff Mills, to bring us a digital-analogue, jazzelectro "New Morning".

You can also find some unique gems from the States at the Ambyss, the youngest festival space, spreading its psybient wings with "multi-instrument-talents" and ethereal electronica whizzkids, like liquid sound designer DF Tram and returning one-woman-orchestra, HÄANA. And as for the 'back to the future' special here, System 7's Steve Hillage is presenting Rainbow Dome Musick, a timeless '79 classic in live performance, with Monique Giraudy. Op Art. We're building a bridge with a hugely exciting Victor Vasarely exhibition, and an Op Art-inspired festival art scene. Vasarely began this movement in the 1930s, around the same time as Abstract Expressionism formed in New York, and became the first specifically American movement to achieve international influence. Contemporary visual language has countless dialects and we're

Our guest for the second time this year will be Oliver Vernon, a member of Furtherrr Collective, an abstract expressionist group from California. This year he's accompanied by Damon Soule, to amaze us with a collective live painting act, as



VISUAL ARTS

Visual and visionary arts also play an important role in expanding our psychedelic experience, taking our minds on mystical journeys. Art makes us feel, and feelings call for no education, only an open heart.

2019 is the year we connect our subcultural visionary art back to one of its roots, 1960s aiming to stretch the borders over what is praised in the psychedelic art scene.

Artists from the USA have contributed with diverse artworks, like Alex Grey & Allyson Grey, who have been blazing trails in the visionary art community for more than three decades. Creatives have joined us over the years, such as electro-mineralist Android well as Damon's sketchbook drawing workshop. Our art-related workshops are free and open all week, where anyone can learn new techniques and channel their freshly formed inspirations into creation.
